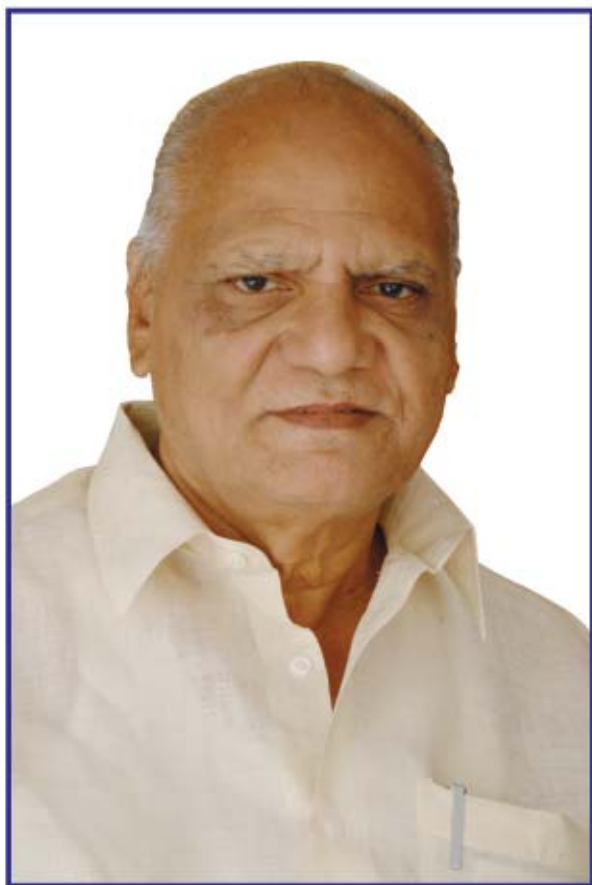

RULES AND REGULATIONS

COLLEGE RULES

- ❖ Students should be regular and punctual to the classes.
- ❖ Each student should wear Identity Card inside the college campus.
- ❖ Students should be seated in the lecture halls at least five minutes before the commencement of classes.
- ❖ Students should maintain perfect order and strict silence inside the lecture halls, laboratories and workshops.
- ❖ Students should attend the laboratory/workshop classes with the specified uniforms.
- ❖ Observation notebooks should be brought to the laboratory classes.
- ❖ Record of experiments done in a particular class should be submitted before the next laboratory/workshop class.
- ❖ Assignments given to the students should be submitted before the due date for consideration of internal assessment marks.
- ❖ A minimum of 90% attendance in each semester is insisted. Students should get prior written permission before absenting the classes. Failure in this respect will be informed to the parents.

- ❖ Each student will be attached to a class counselor and the counselor will advise the students on academic and other activities.
- ❖ The following tests are being conducted in each semester and the results are communicated to the parents.
- ❖ The internal assessment marks will be calculated strictly based on the percentage of marks scored by the students in the above tests/ examinations.
- ❖ Students should attend all tests and show good academic progress.
- ❖ Regularity in writing the tests / exams and satisfactory performance of students in tests/exams are essential to enable the students to earn satisfactory conduct certificate at the end of the programme.
- ❖ Any student found indulging in malpractice in the tests/exams would be debarred for the rest of the tests/examinations. Any case of malpractice in the University examinations will be reported to the University.

RAGGING IN ANY FORM IS TOTALLY BANNED AND ANYONE FOUND INDULGING IN RAGGING IS SEVERELY PUNISHED INCLUDING DISMISSAL FROM THE COLLEGE.

Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts

- a. Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, ill-treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student.
- b. Indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student.
- c. Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or any other student.
- d. Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher.

- e. Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- f. Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students.
- g. Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
- h. Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, posts, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student.
- i. Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

Use of MOBILE PHONES, VIDEO GADGETS, I-PODS, PDA etc. are prohibited.

CLASS ROOM MANNERS

Students are required to be regular and punctual in attending classes / laboratories / workshops / seminars.

Students shall be in their seats in the classroom before the commencement of the classes. In the classroom, everyone is expected to observe proper classroom etiquette.

Unnecessary movement from a bench / table to another bench / table within the class / laboratory / workshop should be avoided.

Students of one class should not go to another class for any reason whatsoever.

ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE

Students should not be absent for the classes without prior permission from the HoD concerned. Students should apply leave in advance for availing leave.

Continuous absence from classes on medical grounds will be permitted only on submission of medical certificate and a letter from the parents, subject to verification.

HOSTEL RULES

- ❖ Full-fledged hostel facilities for boys & girls students have been established inside the campus. It also provides good and safe facilities of lodging and boarding to cater to the needs of outstation students. - ❖ Students should clarify themselves about the defacement of the book before they are taken out from the library on loan. Any subsequent complaint about the deficiency or defacement of the book will not be entertained. Any book found to be defective at the time of return will not be accepted and the student concerned should replace the book by a new one.
- ❖ Books other than reference books and journals will be issued to the students for a period of 15 days at the first instance with the provision for renewal for a further period of 15 days. Extension beyond the first renewal will be permitted only if there is no request for reservation of the book by any other user.
- ❖ Reference books, Project Reports, Journals and Question papers will not be lent out. But, students can make photocopies to a bare minimum number of pages from the books.
- ❖ Books should be returned on the due dates. Belated returns will be accepted only on payment of fine calculated as per the rules in force. Renewal of book can be done only on production of the book on the due date or earlier.

BOOK BANK

Library has a Book Bank facility, which is very much helpful in fulfilling students' requirement for the prescribed books on semester basis. Book Bank functions as one section of the library. **The top three students in each class will be eligible for additional 3 books from book bank.** The privilege will be continued so long as they continue to be one among the top 3 rankers in the class.

The College provides ample opportunities for nurturing and promoting various latent talents of the students.
