RULES AND REGULATIONS

COLLEGE RULES

- Students should be regular and punctual to the classes.
- Each student should wear Identity Card inside the college campus.
- Students should be seated in the lecture halls at least five minutes before the commencement of classes.
- Students should maintain perfect order and strict silence inside the lecture halls, laboratories and workshops.
- Students should attend the laboratory/workshop classes with the specified uniforms.
- Observation notebooks should be brought to the laboratory classes.
- Record of experiments done in a particular class should be submitted before the next laboratory/workshop class.
- Assignments given to the students should be submitted before the due date for consideration of internal assessment marks.
- A minimum of 90% attendance in each semester is insisted. Students should get prior written permission before absenting the classes. Failure in this respect will be informed to the parents.
- All boys should wear only formal dresses with black shoes. All girls should wear salwar or sarees.
- Students should attend all tests and show good academic progress.
- Regularity in writing the tests / exams and satisfactory performance of students in tests/exams are essential to

enable the students to earn satisfactory conduct certificate at the end of the programme.

- Any student found indulging in malpractice in the tests/exams would be debarred for the rest of the tests/examinations. Any case of malpractice in the University examinations will be reported to the University.

RAGGING IN ANY FORM IS TOTALLY BANNED AND ANYONE FOUND INDULGING IN RAGGING IS SEVERELY PUNISHED INCLUDING DISMISSAL FROM THE COLLEGE

Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts

- a. Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, ill-treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student.
- b. Indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student.
- c. Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or any other student.
- d. Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher.
- e. Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- f. Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden

put on a fresher or any other student by students.

- g. Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
- h. Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, posts, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student.
- i. Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

Use of MOBILE PHONES, VIDEO GADGETS,I-PODS, PDA etc. are prohibited.

CLASS ROOM MANNERS

Students are required to be regular and punctual in attending classes / laboratories / workshops / seminars.

Students shall be in their seats in the classroom before the commencement of the classes. In the classroom, everyone is expected to observe proper classroom etiquette.

Unnecessary movement from a bench / table to another bench / table within the class / laboratory / workshop should be avoided.

Students of one class should not go to another class for any reason whatsoever.

ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE

Students should not be absent for the classes without prior permission from the HoD concerned. Students should apply leave in advance for availing leave.

Continuous absence from classes on medical grounds will be permitted only on submission of medical certificate and a letter from the parents, subject to verification.

HOSTEL RULES

- ❖ Students should go to college in formal dress, properly tucked-in, wearing shoes, and clearly shaved face.

- ❖ Hostellers should not go outside the college campus except on holidays by obtaining prior permission from the hostel warden.
- ❖ Students should make proper use of furniture, electrical fittings, bathroom fittings and sanitary fittings.

LIBRARY RULES

- Each student is allowed to draw three books from library. Students should show their identity cards to the librarian for the purpose of identification at the time of using any library facility and borrowing books.
 - Students should clarify themselves about the defacement of the book before they are taken out from the library on loan. Any subsequent complaint about the deficiency or defacement of the book will not be entertained. Any book found to be defective at the time of return will not be accepted and the concerned student should replace the book by a new one.

Books other than reference books and journals will be issued to the students for a period of 15 days at the first instance with the provision for renewal for a further period of 15 days. Extension beyond the first renewal will be permitted only if there is no request for reservation of the book by any other user.

Reference books, Project Reports, Journals and Question papers will not be lent out. But, students can make photocopies to a bare minimum number of pages from the books.

Books should be returned on specified due dates. Deferred returns will be accepted only on payment of fine calculated as per the rules in force.

Renewal of book can be done only on production of the book on the due date or earlier.

It also provides good and safe facilities of lodging and boarding to cater to the needs of outstation students. It has complete facilities with STD, ISD, Gymnasium, a reading room and a computer room. The students are monitored with their well-being by an efficient and qualified custodian.

WATER

Three sophisticated reverse osmosis water purification plants are installed in the campus ensures safe drinking water for the students with the total capacity of **3000 litres/hour**.

CANTEEN

The College canteen with a total area of 1000 sq.m is well equipped with modern steam cooking system and utensils. A big hall with facility for 400 members to dine at a time is an added feature.

INTERNET

The college provides internet facility with **1 Gbps (1:1) RF leased line connection** for staff and students.

SOLAR PANEL

The students have installed an 85Kw stand-alone solar plant on our campus. This plant generates about 350-400 units of power every day. Another 20Kw plant installed in the institution generates 70 units of power per day. On the whole, 420 units are injected to the main EB box. The street lights in the institution and the water heaters in the men's hostel are also solar powered.

WASTE MANAGEMENT

The paper waste collected in the college is sent for treating recycling the waste.

TRANSPORT FACILITIES

- ❖ The College has a fleet of 34 buses operating transportation to students and staff from various parts of the city to the college and back.
- ❖ Students should maintain discipline while travelling in the college bus. Students should carry the bus pass at all times while travelling, failing which they will not be allowed to travel in the bus.
- ❖ Students should wear the ID cards at the time of boarding the bus.
- ❖ Students should not interchange buses/routes without permission.

TEACHING AND LEARNING PROCESS

- The academic administration is in the hands of highly qualified and experienced professionals. They are assisted by a team of dedicated and motivated faculty. Every department is provided with adequate number of faculty supported by Non-Teaching and Administrative Staff.
- Each student will be attached to a class counselor and the counselor will advise the students on academic and other activities. The following tests are being conducted in each semester and the results are communicated to the parents.

- The internal assessment marks will be calculated strictly based on the percentage of marks scored by the students in the above tests/ examinations.

- In addition to the regular classes, special coaching classes are provided for slow learners to improve the result by the teachers in free of cost.
- After the result analysis of every internal assessment & unit test slow learners are identified. Special coaching classes are being conducted regularly for the slow learners to improve their knowledge and University Examination results.
- Teaching and learning process is analyzed periodically for quality education and good result.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

The College provides ample opportunities for nurturing and promoting various latent talents of the students. National level technical symposia and conferences organized by various departments and International conferences organized by PG departments of the college help them to exhibit their talents.

NSS

The N.S.S. unit of the college conducts special literacy campus, adult education programme and health camps in nearby villages and human chain insisting on the awareness of learning. To expose the students to the issues concerning society, experts from various fields are regularly invited to address the students. Social ethics is a value based educational class wherein students are more aware of their social rights and responsibilities and become responsible human beings.

YRC

The Youth Red Cross unit conducts Blood donation camp, eye camp, workshop on social issues periodically.

- The gearshift of all the talents is the Cultural activity ELANSA where the students gain their identity besides their technical knowledge.

SPORTS ACTIVITIES

The College has sports and games facilities for both boys and girls inside and outside the campus. Daily practice is provided for students between 4 and 5 pm. Besides the academic activities students would like to get their attention relieved and focused on fun and physique.

Sports activities help the students to keep them fit both mentally and physically. **The college has five different houses which consist of players from different departments.**

The institution provides abundant facilities for the students to get accustomed with the varied sports activities like **Basket Ball, Football, Hockey, Cricket, Throw ball, Ball-badminton, Kabaddi, Athletics, Kho-Kho, Volley Ball** and indoor games like **Badminton, Chess, Carom, Table Tennis and Weight-lifting.**

SA Trophy state level Intercollegiate and School level Tournaments for Basket Ball, Volley Ball & Table Tennis are organized in the college premises and cash prize **more than 5 lakhs** is awarded to the winners of the trophy.

Anna University Zonal Kabbadi and Interzonal Tournaments are conducted in the campus. Students participate and win prizes in **International Karate Competition** and All India Inter University Tournaments for **Best Physique and Boxing** which adds a **diamond in the crown of SAEC.**
